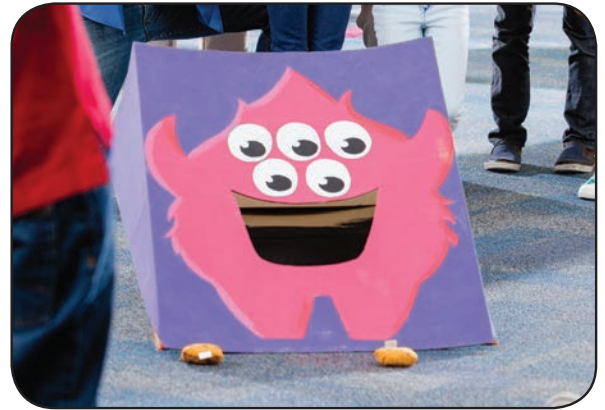


Monster Bean Bag Toss Instructions

Supplies*:

- 2 tri-fold boards
- Purple, magenta, white, and black paint
- Masking tape
- Paintbrushes



Directions:

1. Using the template on page 3, project the monster onto the center of one of the tri-fold boards and trace with a pencil.
2. Cut out any extra space on the top or bottom of the monster, as shown in **Figure 1**.
3. Cut along the dotted lines, as shown in **Figure 2**. Make sure the bottom is the narrow end.
4. Once those pieces are cut, you should have three separate pieces, as shown in **Figure 3**.

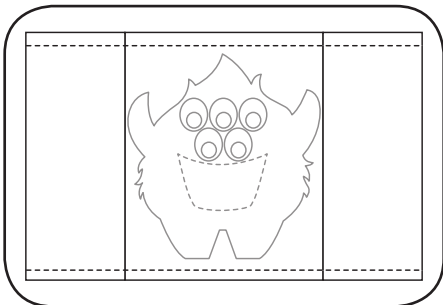

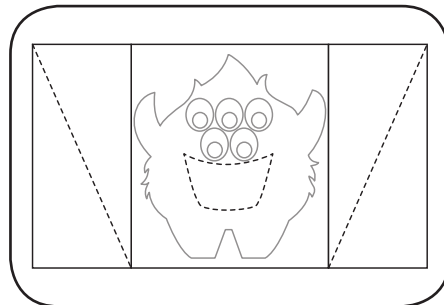

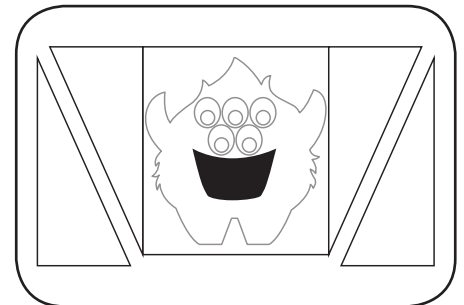

5. Using masking tape, re-tape the pieces together, as shown in **Figure 4**.
6. Re-enforce the pieces with masking tape on the back as well, as shown in **Figure 5**.
7. Fold the two triangular flaps in and tape the two corners together to hold in place, as shown in **Figure 6**.

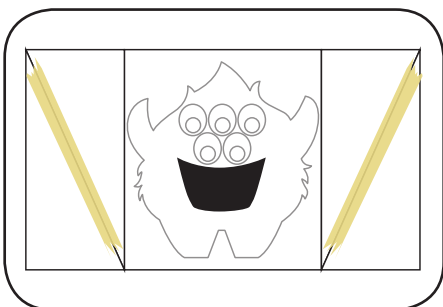

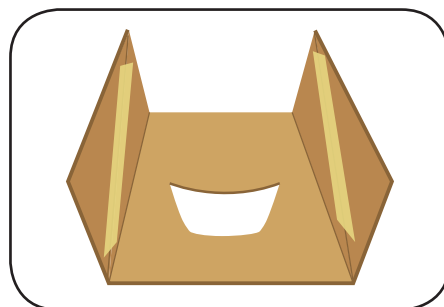

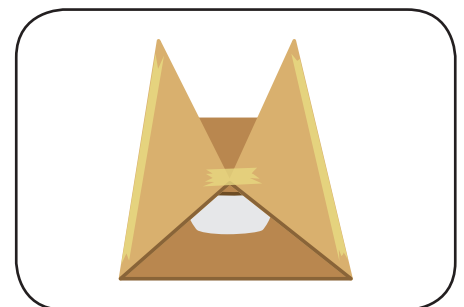

*Remember, these are only suggestions. This should be fun and creative, so use supplies you have on hand for substitutions.

8. Cut out the center of another tri-fold and cut it down about an inch so that it is slightly smaller than the bean bag toss, as shown in **Figure 7**.
9. Tape this new piece to the back of the bean bag toss. See **Figure 8**.
10. Flip the box over. Your bean bag toss should look like **Figure 9**.

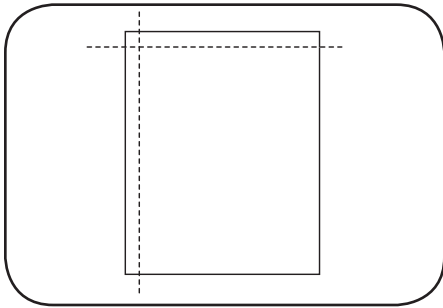

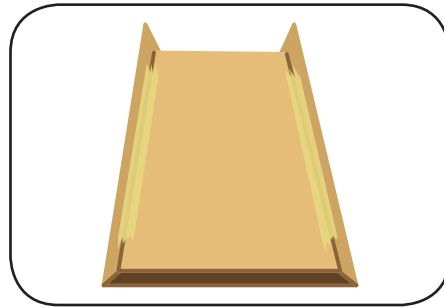

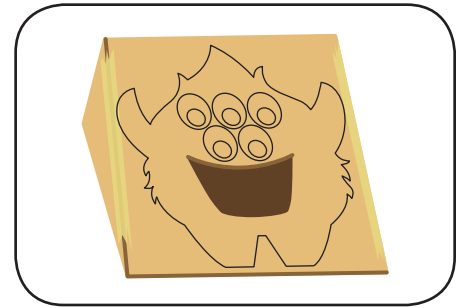

11. Paint the background purple, as shown in **Figure 10**.
12. Paint the monster magenta, as shown in **Figure 11**.
13. Paint the eyes using black and white paint, as shown in **Figure 12**.

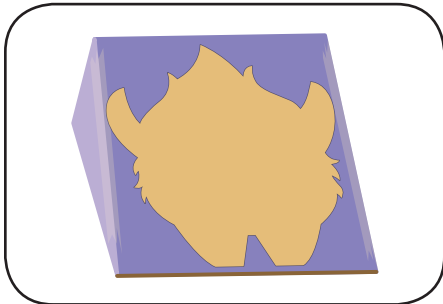

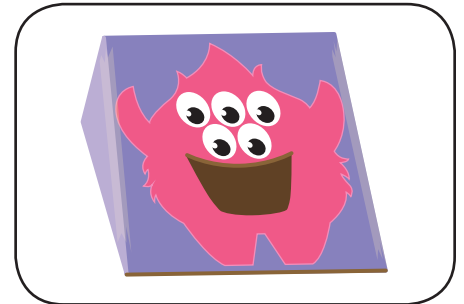
